ELIGIBILITY

- Athletes will be selected and invited to compete by Judo Canada High Performance Director.
- Athletes must compete for the provincial association of which they are a member in good standing and affiliated and follow their province's rules.
- All members and coaches **MUST** have completed the Respect & Sport online module in the past twelve (12) months at the time of the event. If you completed it for the 2020 Elite National Championships, you will have to redo it for the 2022 edition.

- All participants must present a picture ID with their accreditation at weigh-in.
- U18: non-Canadian citizens and non-permanent residents are eligible, provided that they have been a member of Judo Canada for the last 2 years.
- Seniors: only Canadian citizens, permanent residents or IJF approved are allowed to compete in this tournament.
- All participants must be doubly vaccinated. Proof will be required on Trackie registration form. The Saville Community Sports Center is participating in the Alberta REP (Restrictions Exemption Program):
 - To enter spaces participating in the Restrictions Exemption Program, people ages 12 and older must be fully vaccinated (at least 14 days from second dose of a 2-dose vaccine or a single dose of Janssen).
 - Valid proof of vaccination:
 - Alberta vaccine record with QR Code (paper or digital) is now the only valid Alberta-issued proof of vaccination accepted by operators participating in REP.
 - Other accepted forms of proof of vaccination include:
 - Other provincial vaccine records with QR codes
 - First Nation vaccine records
 - Canadian Armed Forces vaccine records
 - U.S. Military proof of vaccination and ID card
 - Out-of-country vaccine records
 - Personal identification that matches the vaccine record is also required for all adults 18 and over.
 - **Participants must be able to provide proof of double vaccination while at the Saville Community Sports Center.**

ANTI-DOPING CONTROL (CCES)

Each participant in the Elite National Championship is subject to a doping control by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) on a random basis in accordance with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP). To avoid an inadvertent positive test and the consequences of an anti-doping rule violation, athletes are encouraged to take the following steps:

- Be familiar with www.cces.ca/athletezone;
- Check with DRO Global (www.globaldro.com) to determine if have any prescription or use over-the-counter medications or treatments that are banned by the WADA Prohibited List.
- Review medical exception requirements (www.cces.ca/medical) if you require the use of a banned medication for a legitimate medical reason.
- Do not use supplements, or take precautions prior to doing so. Supplement products cannot be verified by the CCES or in the Global DRO. A lack of industry and government regulation makes it impossible to confirm their ingredients. Read more at: www.cces.ca/supplements.

- Please note that the USE OF CANNABIS will cause a positive anti-doping test result.

COMPETITION FORMAT

- **U18 & SENIORS:**
 - o The modified double elimination format will be used which guarantees a minimum of 2 bouts to each athlete
 - o In weight categories with five (5) or fewer competitors, the round-robin format will be used.
 - o Tournament regulations as per Judo Canada's *Sanction Policy and Tournament Standards – 2021-2022*.

All issues/cases(s) that are unexpected or deemed exceptional circumstances will be solved by decisions taken by the Judo Canada Sport Committee in cooperation with the Organizing Committee.

MEDAL CEREMONY

Medal winners must attend the medal ceremony in their WHITE judogi. Medal winners who refuse to participate in the ceremony will be removed from the result list and will not place (carding points may be removed).

No promotion articles are authorized to be used/displayed (head covering, flags, T-shirt, socks or similar items).

DAMAGES

No use of bleeding dyes on the body or hair of competitors is allowed. In cases such use is undetected and damage results to the equipment of the opponent or tatami, the competitor will be disqualified and the Provincial or Territorial Association of which that individual is a member will be charged for the damage.

INSURANCE

Judo Canada (or any of its officials or members) will not be liable or responsible for any personal injury nor for any loss or damage to any property resulting from participation and travelling in connection with these championships.
