ELIGIBILITY

- Athletes must compete for the provincial association of which they are a member in good standing and have a valid Judo Canada membership card.
- Only Canadian citizens and permanent residents are allowed to participate in the competition in the U21/Senior/Veteran/Kata events.

NOTE: *in the U18 and U16 events, as well as in the Ne-waza event, athletes who are not Canadian citizens or permanent residents residing in Canada with a minimum of two seasons of membership with Judo Canada are eligible to compete or athletes with approved IJF Refugees status.*

- The provinces and territories are responsible for ensuring that the athletes they register are eligible.
- Coaches must complete the “Respect in Sport for Activity Leaders” to get their accreditation. Coaches who haven’t completed the module won’t be allowed to coach during the tournament. This training is with cost. Click on the following link to access the module: <https://judo-canada-al.respectgroupinc.com/>. Training must be completed before registration deadline April 26, 2026.
- A valid course must have been completed after January 1, 2021.

REGISTRATION

- Provincial/Territorial Associations are responsible for selection and registration of their teams.
- Request for the approval of an early bloomer's have to be done here: <https://bit.ly/3JGaOO3>. *The regulations as published in the 2024-2025 edition of the JC Sanctioning policy and tournament standards will apply. Deadline for confirmation of early Bloomer status is April 18, 2025*

- All entries, including second entries, will have to be done **no later than Friday, April 23rd, 2026**, on Trackie by the PTSO with the following the links:

- Entries received after the specified above deadline are subject to an additional \$50/entry. Late entries, second entries and changes to the original registration will be accepted until the end of the accreditation period 6pm on May 13th for Kata and ne-waza events and 5pm on May 14th for all other events.

*Judo Canada Sanctioning Policy and Tournaments Standards 2025-2026 apply for Early Bloomer Athletes.

** The organizers reserve the right to modify or combine weight and/or age divisions in case of an inadequate number of participants.

NOTE: No athlete is allowed to compete in three different age divisions in this tournament unless otherwise approved on a case-by-case basis by the High-Performance Committee. However, the Ne-waza and Kata event are not included in this restriction.

ANTI-DOPING CONTROL (CCES)

Each participant in the National Championship is potentially subject to a doping control by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) on a random basis in accordance with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP). To avoid an inadvertent positive test and the consequences of an anti-doping rule violation, athletes are encouraged to take the following steps:

- Be familiar with www.cces.ca/athletezone;
- Check with DRO Global (www.globaldro.com) to determine if any prescription or over-the-counter medications or treatments that are banned by the WADA Prohibited List.
- Review medical exception requirements (www.cces.ca/medical) if you require the use of a banned medication for a legitimate medical reason.
- Do not use supplements or take precautions prior to doing so. Supplement products cannot be verified by the CCES or in the Global DRO. A lack of industry and government regulation makes it impossible to confirm their ingredients. Read more at: www.cces.ca/supplements.

COMPETITION FORMAT

- The modified double elimination format will be used.
- In weight categories with five (5) or fewer competitors, the round-robin format will be used.
- In weight categories with 6 and 7 competitors, the two-pool system will be used.
- Tournament regulations as per Judo Canada's Sanctioning Policy and Tournament Standards – 2025-2026.

At the end of Ne-waza Senior event, a Grand Championship will take place. The winners between:

- (i) the n°1 lightweight vs n°1 in middle weight and
- (ii) the n°1 heavy weight vs n° 2 in middle weight in a direct elimination format.

With winners fighting for the "Ne-waza Senior Grand Champion Belt" and \$500 bursary.

All issues/cases(s) that are unexpected or deemed exceptional circumstances will be solved by decisions taken by the Judo Canada Sport Committee in cooperation with the Organizing Committee.

MEDAL CEREMONY

Medal winners must attend the medal ceremony in their WHITE judogi. Medal winners who refuse to participate in the ceremony will be removed from the result list and will not place (carding points may be removed).

No promotion articles are authorized to be used/displayed (flags, T-shirt, socks or similar items).

DAMAGES

No use of bleeding dyes on the body or hair of competitors is allowed. In cases such use is undetected and damage results to the equipment of the opponent or tatami, the competitor will be disqualified and the Provincial or Territorial Association of which that individual is a member will be charged for the damage.

INSURANCE

Judo Canada (or any of its officials or members) will not be liable or responsible for any personal injury nor for any loss or damage to any property resulting from participation and travelling in connection with these championships.

BANQUET AND DANCE

Banquet and dance will be held on Sunday, May 17th at 6:30pm at the Red & White Club.

Banquet tickets must be ordered in advance and the payment received by **April 23rd, 2026**. Tickets are \$80 per participant.

The banquet is an alcohol-free event and subject to provincial laws.

Tickets will be handed to the person responsible for the team at the accreditations.

MORE INFORMATION

NOTE: The Tournament Director and Judo Canada reserve the right to revoke the accreditation of anyone showing blatant disrespect for the rules and procedures of the competition.

- A minimum of 2 competitors must be registered in a weight category for the competition to take place.
- Medals are only awarded if an athlete has won a match and according to Judo Canada Sanctioning Policy and Tournament Standards 2025-2026.
- This tournament will hold Kata competitions for Nage-no-kata, Katame-no-kata, Kime-no-kata, Ju-no-kata, Kodokan Goshin-jutsu, Itsutsu-no-kata and Koshiki-no-kata separately for the U16, U18, U21 and Senior age divisions. There are no gender specific divisions, so all pairs are welcome. Multiple entries are accepted. The same competitor can enter only once in the same kata.
- FOR SHIAI: Both the blue and white judogis are mandatory. Reversible judogis will be accepted.
- FOR KATA: White judogis only. No red & white belts.
- Each province (including officials) is responsible for reserving its own accommodation according to format specified in this package.
- Each athlete is required to present identification with photo at the weigh-in
- Only one representative per province shall come to the accreditations to collect the cards and event packages.
- They will be no paper copies of the draw.
